## **Student strength**

The academic activities for B.Ed. of the year 2016-'18 were formally inaugurated by Rev. Fr. Sebastian Chamathara, Manager of the college on 25<sup>th</sup> July 2016. We have been maintaining a student strength of 50 each for B.Ed. programme 2016-18 and 2017-'19 batch, satisfying the norms prescribed by the NCTE. At present we have a total of 48 students - 10 students in English, 11 students in Mathematics, 5 students in Natural Science, 13 students in the Physical Science and 9 students in the Social Science in 2016-18 batch and a total of 50 students - 10 students in English, 10 students in Mathematics, 11 students in Natural Science, 10 students in the Physical Science and 9 students in the Social Science in 2017-'19 batch. We have 6 students in four subjects for the two year M.Ed. programme of 2016-'18 batch and 2 students in the 2017-'19 batch. The orientation programme on curricular and co-curricular activities of the college for the two year B.Ed. batch of 2016-'18 was held from 26<sup>th</sup> July 2016 to 29<sup>th</sup> July 2016.

I am indeed happy to state that our students were very co-operative and they actively participated in all the activities of the college. I appreciate their responsible behavior throughout the academic year.

## **University Practical Examination**

## **Examination Results**

We had good results in the previous academic year. Out of the 48 students (2015-17 batch) who appeared for the B.Ed. exam, 10 got A+, 22 got A, 13 got B and 3 got C. Miss. Annet T. Catherine secured the highest GPA among the students. Out of the 35 students of the 2014-15 M.Ed. batch, 6 got A, 22 got B+ and 7 got B. Hearty congratulations to all of them.
