Saint KURIAKOSE ELIAS CHAVARA

St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara was born at Kainakary, Kerala on 10th February 1805. He was ordained as a priest in 1829. Along with Fr. Thomas Palackal and Fr. Thomas Porukara, he founded the first indigenous religious congregation at Mannanam, the Carmelites of Mary Immaculate. He started a Sanskrit school in 1846 at Mannanam. St. Chavara set up the first Catholic Press at Mannanam in 1846, from which a network of priniting houses, managed by the CMI Congregation spread over the country. In 1866, with Fr. Leopold Beccaro, he started the Congregation of the Mother of Carmel for Women (CMC). He died on 3rd January, 1871. His Holiness Pope John Paul II conferred the formal recognition of the Church by beatifying him on 8th February, 1986. St. Chavara was canonized on 23rd November 2014 in Rome by Pope Francis.
